Your task is to create and draw an animal or creature that has **at least 5 different adaptations** that would be able to survive in an Alberta Wetland.

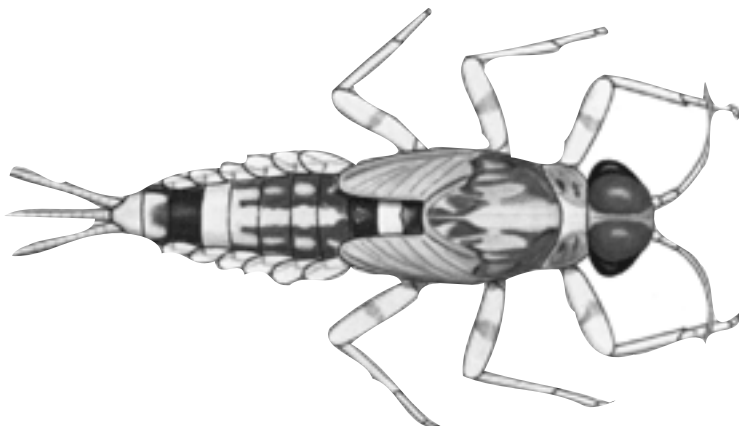
Things to remember:

- Each adaptation must be labelled and clearly shown in your picture
- Explain what the adaptation is, how this adaptation helps your creature and the animal/creature that it's from
- Your rough draft needs to be approved by a teacher
- Adaptations must be from real-life wetland creatures (no fire-breathing alien zombies, gentlemen)

...for your poster:

- Clearly and neatly labelled
- Completely coloured in (no white spaces)
- Include the name of your creature
